8:00 a.m. Holy Eucharist & Healing Service

Note: The laying on of hands for healing is an optional part of this service.



Sunday Worship & Formation

7:45 a.m. Holy Eucharist

(45 minutes)

This Spoken Eucharist uses traditional language from The Book of Common Prayer, and includes a modest amount of organ music and hymns.

9:00 a.m. Holy Eucharist (60 minutes)

This Sung Eucharist features our Intergenerational Choir. The Eucharistic prayer is from Enriching Our Worship, the newest of the Episcopal Church's communion prayers. Many children and youth attend this service, and its pace and energy help keep them engaged. Adult Formation classes begin shortly afterward.

10:15 a.m. Christian Formation for all ages (45 minutes)

All classes are held in the Parish Center.

11:15 a.m. Holy Eucharist (65 minutes)

This Sung Eucharist is led by St. Paul's Adult Choir. The liturgy has a contemplative quality and reflects the tradition of fine choral singing. Sunday School and Adult Formation classes are held prior.
