Journey to Adulthood

St. Paul's uses the Journey to Adulthood program.

Rite 13 for 7th and 8th graders and J2A for 9th – 12th graders. The program has two guiding principles: 1) Manhood and womanhood are gifts from God. 2) Adulthood must be earned. The lessons are scripturally based, focusing on four areas of study: self, society, spirituality, and sexuality.

“Gap Kids” are 5th and 6th graders who will be invited to a Youth Group activity once a month and who will have their own group event once a month.

Youth Group Gatherings

The Youth Group meets the last Sunday of the month and some additional weekend evenings. The youth participate in activities, which range from recreational to service-oriented, informative programs. The service and informative

sessions will be activities from the Journey to Adulthood program that are too long to complete on

Sunday mornings. In addition, the Rite 13 and J2A will meet separately for program pieces and some recreational activities, but together



for most service projects. Our service projects include the CROP WALK, Christmas Families Project, and the annual Youth Mission Trip during the summer.



Youth Advisory Group (YAG)

The Youth Advisory Group (YAG) is comprised of youth and adults who meet quarterly or more often to plan our recreational Sunday evening activities and special events.

Acolytes

Youth Confirmation Inquiry Classes

In late January of each year, youth who will reach the age of 16 in that calendar year are invited to begin the process of inquiring about Confirmation. We use a mentoring program, *Keeping the Promise* by Andrew D. Parker. Confirmands meet with their mentor to explore the text, *My Faith, My Life* by Jenifer Gamber. One may choose one's own mentor. In addition, there are three dinner meetings of the class, and a preconfirmation gathering with the Bishop. Confirmation is held in the Easter season. Confirmation dates are announced in early spring.

Frequently asked questions about Confirmation

Do I have to be confirmed?

No. By virtue of your Baptism, you are a full member of the Body of Christ, the Church.

What if my mentor is not a member of St. Paul's?

No problem. Your mentor needs to be a baptized person who worships regularly at a Christian church.
