Our young people will delve into the story of Jairus' daughter for the evening with engaging activities focusing on praying for those who are ill.

How does prayer shape our moral actions? Are there ways that prayer that could push or challenge us in our decision making, daily living, and relationships? Prayer and the News Thursday, March 25

Have you ever noticed how the schedule for daily broadcast news corresponds to the times for prayer modeled in the Daily Office in our prayer book? On this evening we explore ways that news can call us to prayer. Debby Knox, WISH-TV's 24-Hour News 8's lead anchor, will discuss changing trends in the news in our city and how journalists decide which stories to highlight. Then, The Rev. Keith Hosey, CSSP, a contemplative prayer leader will lead us in reflecting together on the news as a call to prayer—both prayers of thanksgiving for signs of God's presence in the world, and prayers of intercession for the needs of the world. Children will make a globe and a prayer box and spend time in creative prayer for Haiti, and teens will spend time with the labyrinth.
